## **Bloedel Plant Profile - The Monkey Plant**



The Monkey Plant is a small colourful plant from Brazil. The leaves are dark green on top with silvery-grey veins. Underneath the leaves are purple. The flowers are bright pink tubes. The name 'Monkey Plant' comes from the seeds which look like the face of a monkey. The leaves are soft, giving rise to another common name of 'Trailing velvet plant'.

The Monkey Plant's Latin name is *Ruellia makoyana*. The first part, *Ruellia*, is the plant Genus. There are many different Ruellias. The second part, *makoyana*, tells you **which** Ruellia it is.

The name *Ruellia* commemorates the French herbalist Jean de la Ruelle (1474-1537)<sup>3</sup>. The Monkey Plant Ruellia, *makoyana*, honours Mr Lambert Jacob Macoy (1790-1873)<sup>4</sup> of Liege, Belgium. He was a horticulturalist and plant importer. He brought many plants into cultivation. There are ten plants in eight plant families given his name. The most well known is probably the 'Peacock Plant', *Calathea makoyana*.

Simple observations will tell you a lot about this plant and other plants.

- It has brightly coloured flowers. They will attract pollinators who can see colours. Pollination probably takes place during the day.
- The flowers have long thin tubes. The pollinators most probably have long thin tongues. An example is a hummingbird.
- The underside of the leaf is purple, an adaptation which helps it grow in shade. It probably evolved as a forest floor plant.



The monkey plant is a good indoor plant<sup>5</sup> and has won the Royal Horticultural Society Award of Garden Merit. Hanging baskets are a good way to display the colour under the leaves.<sup>6</sup>
