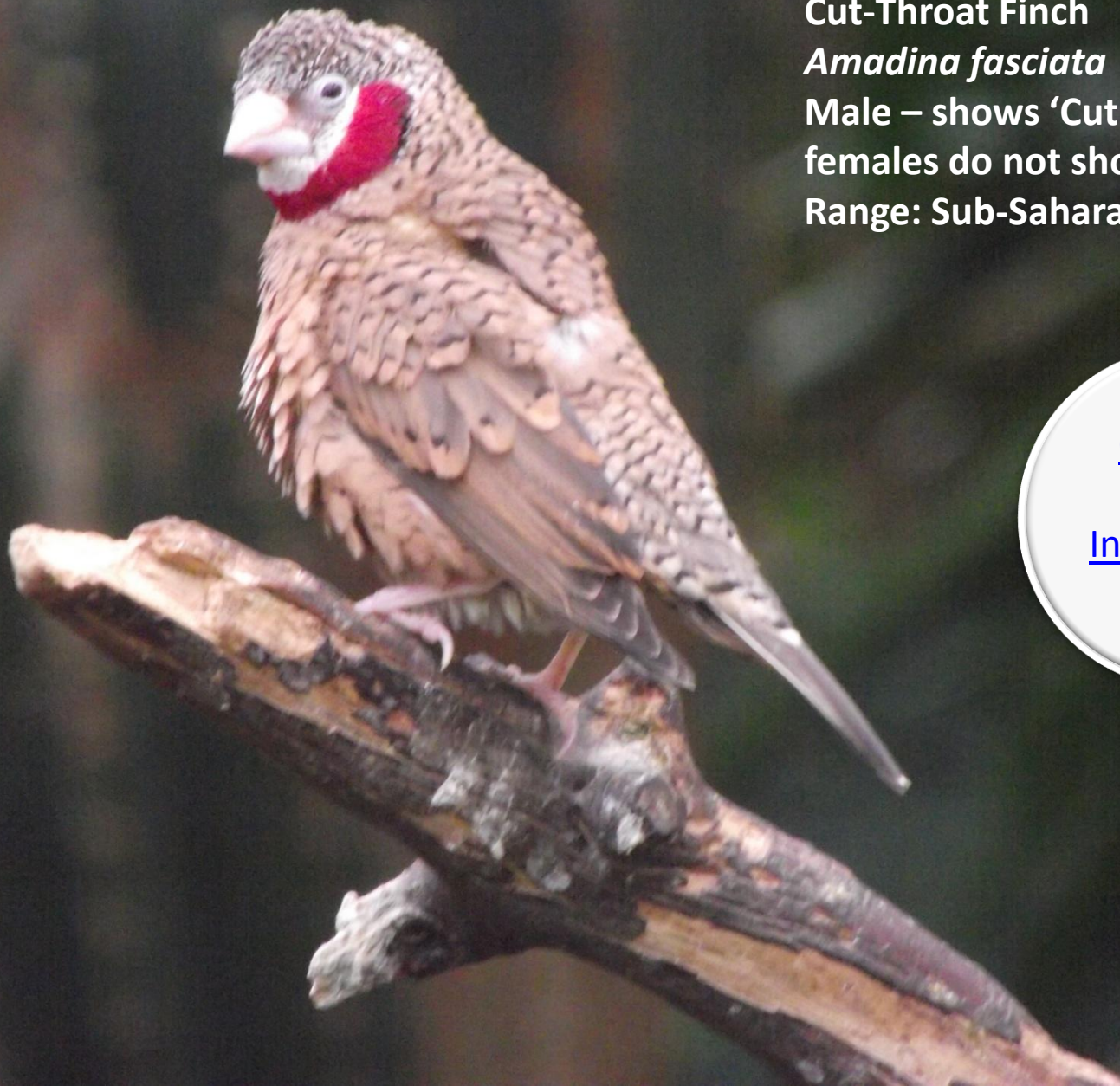

Amadina fasciata


Male – shows 'Cut Throat' the
